OUR VISION: NO RURAL MUM LEFT BEHIND

Motherland is a national charity that connects rural mothers across Australia and delivers services that reduce isolation and improve mental health outcomes.

Motherland's mission is to eliminate the crippling isolation many rural mums face by connecting them to a supportive online community and offering support services including a mothers group program that every rural mum can access, regardless of her location.

Through the Motherland podcast, our Motherland Village program, Motherland Connect platform, fundraising events, online community, and advocacy we have become the voice and village that rural mums desperately needed but didn't have, until Motherland.

THE MOTHER OF ALL JOURNEYS



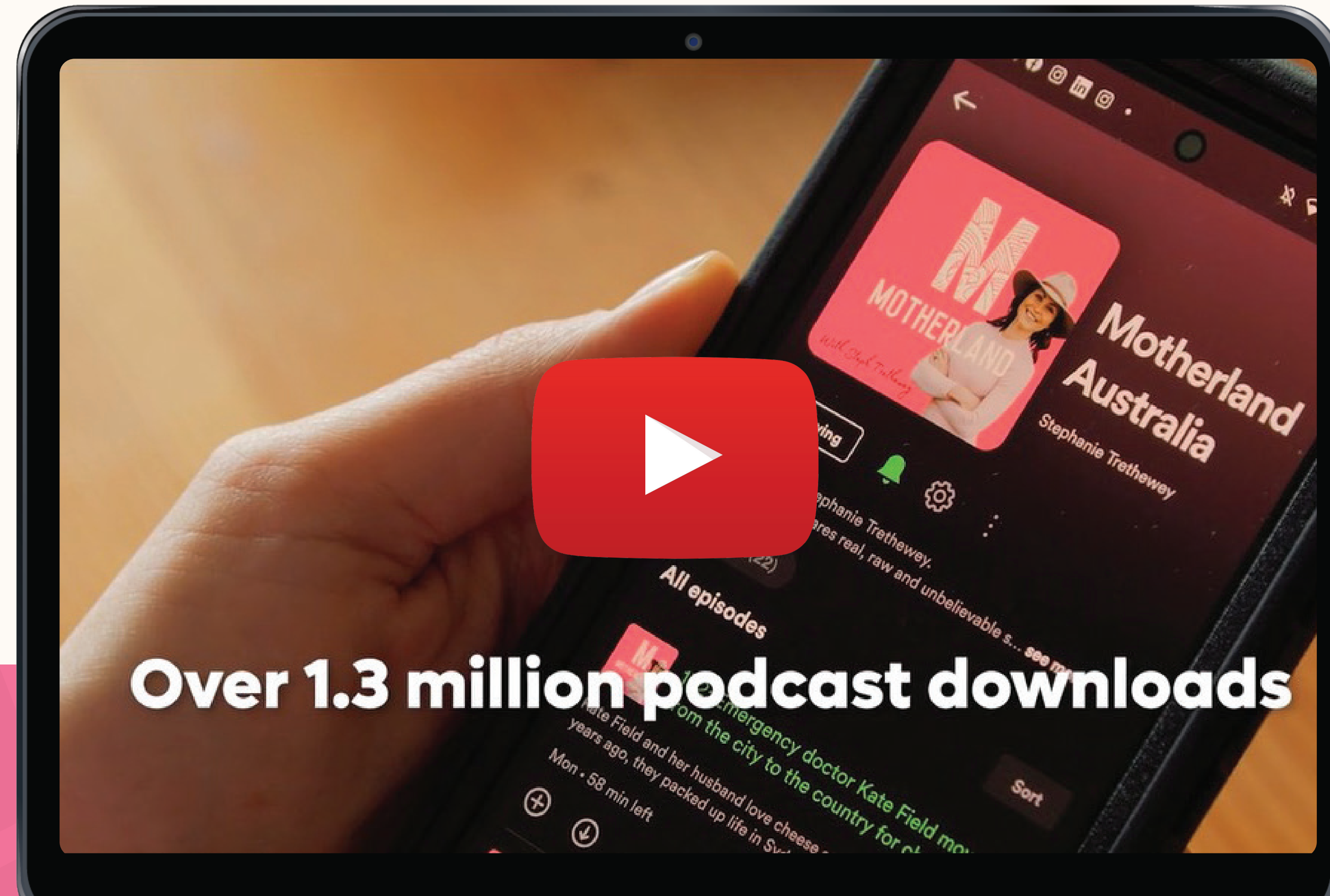

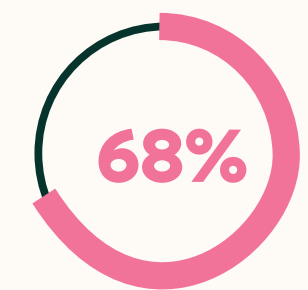

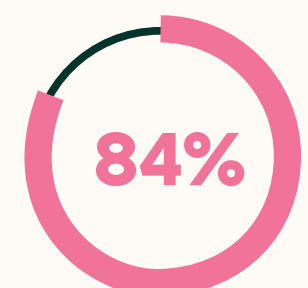

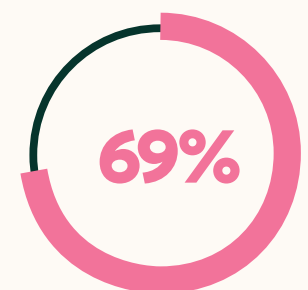

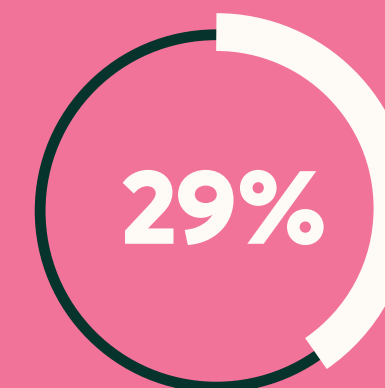

Steph and Motherland are regularly featured across Australia's most widely read publications, leading podcasts and national media platforms, amplifying the voices and experiences of rural families.

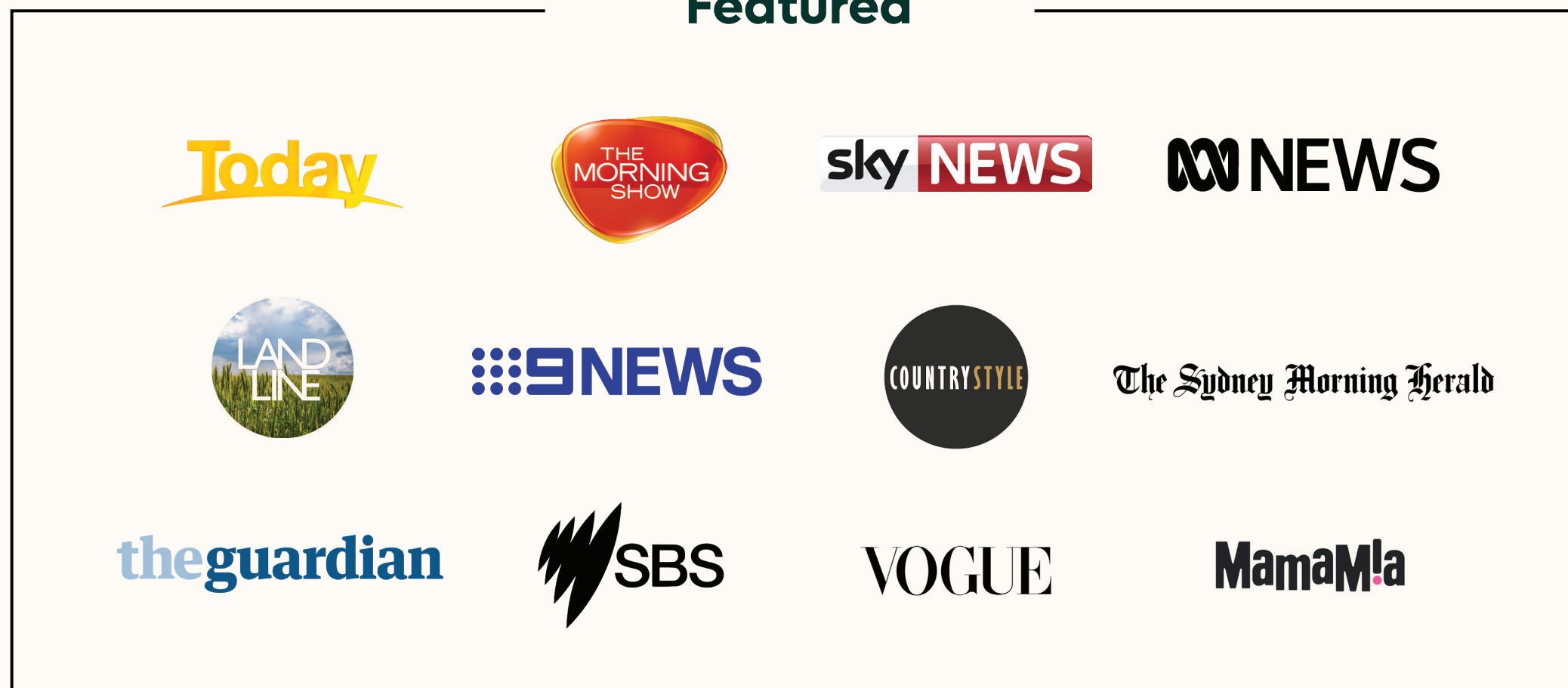

FATHER LAND

In 2025, Motherland expanded its storytelling impact with the launch of Father Land, a groundbreaking eight-episode podcast series amplifying the voices of rural fathers for the first time.

Hosted by Motherland Founder & CEO Stephanie Trethewey, the series created a powerful platform for raw, unfiltered conversations about fatherhood, identity and mental health in the bush; topics too often left unspoken.

Featuring eight fathers from seven states, including farmers, community leaders and high-profile Australians, Father Land offered deeply personal insights into the pressures facing rural men, from isolation and financial strain to the weight of staying strong for their families.

Trusted with stories many had never shared publicly before, the series struck a national chord, reaching nearly 25,000 downloads and reinforcing Motherland's commitment to elevating unheard voices and strengthening rural families and communities.

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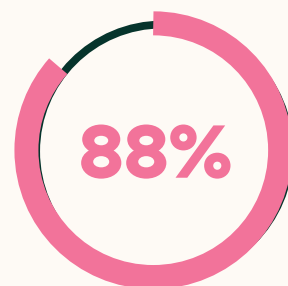
MOTHERLAND VILLAGE DATA

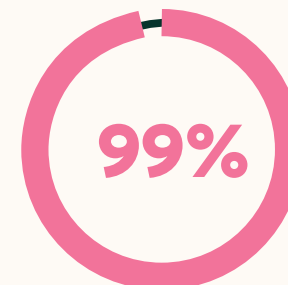

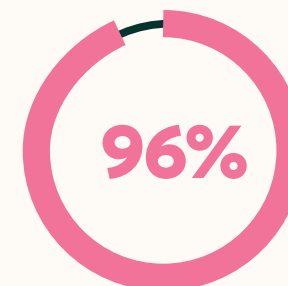

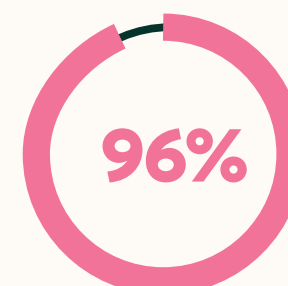

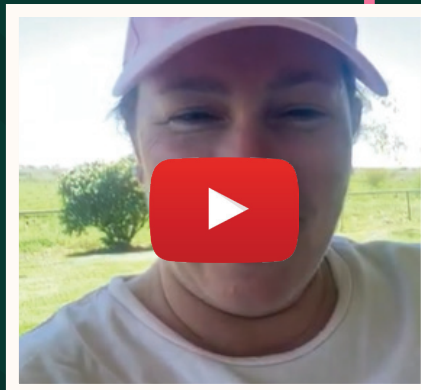

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

In the first 2.5 years of the Motherland Village Scholarship Fund, we've supported 89 rural mums into our program via scholarship, to enable isolated rural mothers experiencing financial hardship to access the program for free.

In 2025 - 54% of our program participants were scholarship recipients.

MOTHERLAND CONNECT

In September 2024, we launched Motherland Connect - Australia's first dedicated digital resource hub designed specifically for rural mums.

Created as a trusted one-stop platform that connects women with the services they need to support their mental, emotional and physical wellbeing - as well as the wellbeing of their families.

The platform features businesses and organisations offering both in-person and telehealth support across a broad range of categories, ensuring rural mums can access help - no matter where they live.

Growth & Reach (as at December 2025)

- Listed services have appeared in over **25,000 search results**
- An average of **380 visitors per month**

The Motherland Connect platform delivers a significant impact on access to healthcare for rural and remote Australians.

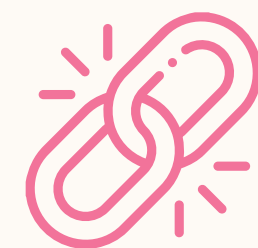
- **95% of rural mums** feel confident that the businesses and organisations are trustworthy and safe for rural mums.
- **Nearly four in five rural mums** have put off seeking healthcare because they cannot access or find the right services.
- **45% of rural families have at least** one family member with additional health needs and challenges.
- **More than 60% of rural mums** say their local community does not have the health services to support their families.



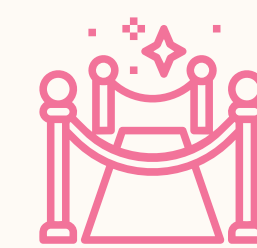


2025 FUNDRAISING EVENTS

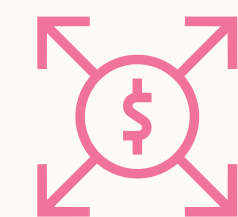
- Motherland delivered five fundraising events across rural Australia, significantly expanding our in-person reach and impact.
- Across Deniliquin (NSW); Kingaroy, Clermont and Quilpie (QLD); and our first-ever Western Australian event in Darkan (WA), Motherland connected 857 rural mums, an ~80% increase in in-person attendance on 2024, reflecting growing demand for meaningful, face-to-face connection.
- With the support of 58 sponsors and grant partners, our 2025 fundraisers generated \$148K in total profit - almost tripling funds raised in 2024.
- These funds directly support Motherland's mental health and wellbeing initiatives for rural mums, including critical investment in our national Scholarship Fund. We are proud to confirm that 52 mums attended our events in 2025 for free thanks to our Scholarship Fund.

2026 NATIONAL CONFERENCE

Motherland progressed planning throughout 2025 for our next National Conference, to be held in March 2026.

Ticket sales launched in July 2025, with all 350 conference tickets sold out by October 2025 - five months ahead of the event!

The Conference Gala Dinner, also reached capacity, selling out at 550 guests by December 2025.

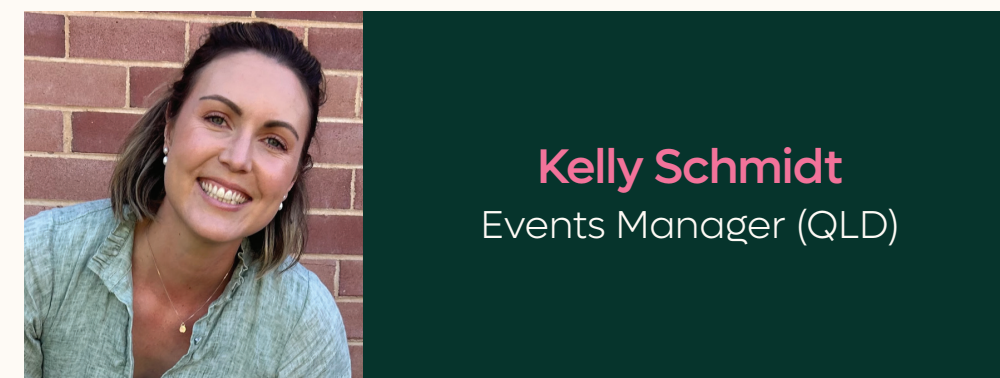
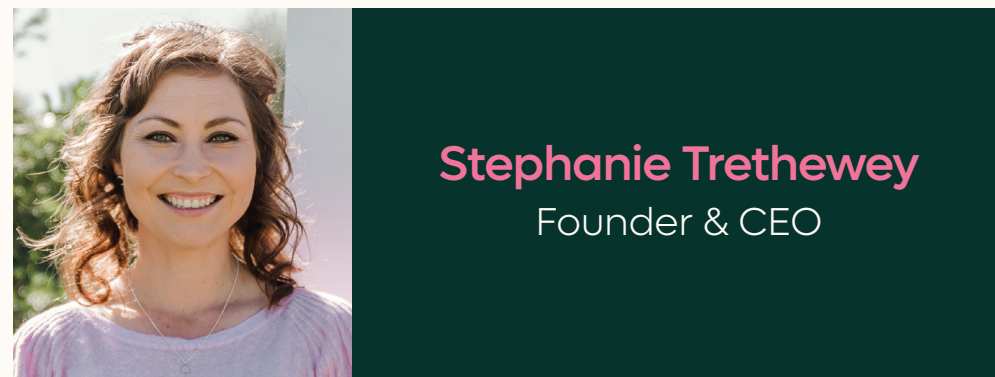
In July 2022 Motherland became a national charity following the incredible growth of our organisation and the need to support more rural mums.
